What has been happening this week?

On 8 May 1945, the then Prime Minister Winston Churchill announced that the war in Europe had come to an end, following Germany's surrender the day before. This became known as VE Day, or Victory in Europe Day, and it is commemorated every year on 8th May. Yesterday marked the 80th anniversary of the original VE Day. Today we have held assemblies to show some of the ways VE day was marked and remembered yesterday. If you would like to discuss the history related to VE day, we would recommend using BBC bitesize. You can find short videos and resources to support any conversation you may have with your child.



Yesterday we welcomed the Breck Foundation to school to run workshops for all of our children on online safety. Teachers said that the workshops were necessary and informative for the children and the delivery was excellent.
