Flu Immunisation Form: This has gone out ready to be filled in, to keep us all nice and healthy this winter. Check your spam/ junk if you have not received it.

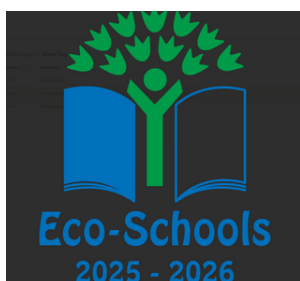


Get involved with F@B!
